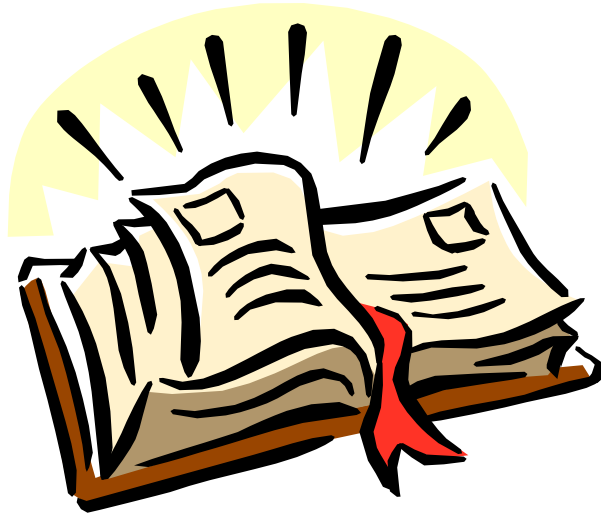

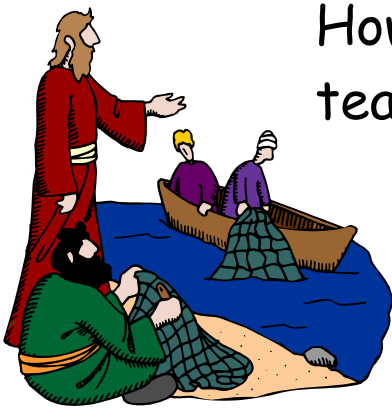

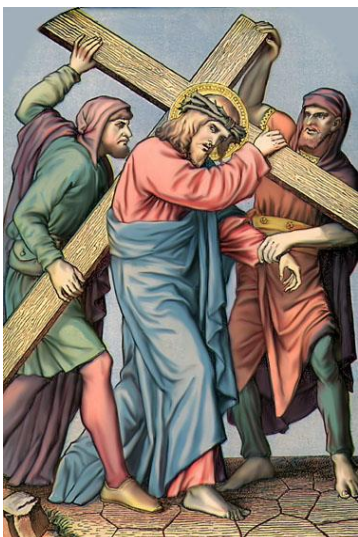
How did the following saints actually live the teachings of Jesus?

At this age children are noticing the conflict between society and the teachings of Jesus Christ and the Church. They see them in school, in their activities and in the world.

Through the broad use of newspapers, magazines, news programs on TV, and the wide use of the internet our children are aware of societal issues at a much earlier age than their parents and grandparents. Our children are dealing with adult issues before they are really adults.

It is up to parents to guide them through this maze of what society says is right and good and what Jesus tells us is right and good.

It is not always easy following our beliefs and morals. If we (the parents and the Church) do not guide our children's moral development, then all the outside influences will.



Talk to your children and be an example to them about how they can respect themselves and others by their responsible use of the gift of sexuality through growth in chastity and modesty.

While you talk to your children about respect and modesty, this might be a good **time** to talk about how we should respect God in His house.

Do you behave in a respectful manner to God and the people around you?

What about the clothing you wear to mass, are you wearing clothes that represent the respect that God deserves?

You and your children should be able to discuss the Church's response to problem areas in sexuality and related issues, such as: pornography, rape, incest, molestation, AID's, STD's, misuse of drugs and alcohol and prostitution.
